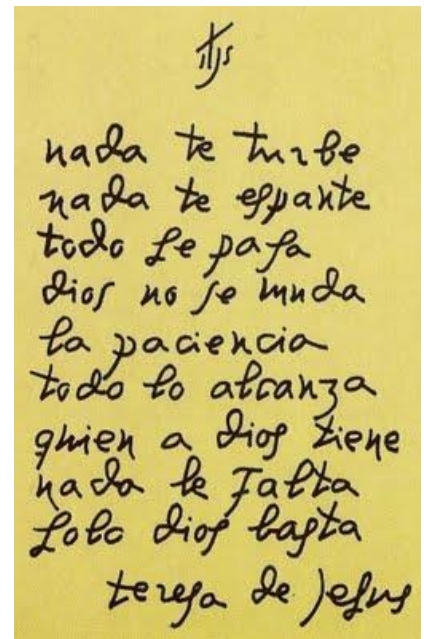

Priest's Message

The image to the right is a famous prayer by Saint Teresa of Avila. Teresa (1515-1582) was a Carmelite nun, Spanish mystic and declared a Doctor of the church. The text seen here in her own handwriting translates as follows: ***“Let nothing disturb you, let nothing frighten you, all things pass away: God never changes. Patience obtains all things. Whoever has God finds they lack nothing; God alone suffices.”*** This incredibly comforting piece of spiritual insight was turned into a beautiful worship chant in the Taize community entitled “Nada te Turbe”. It is my favourite Taize chant and you might like to listen to it here as a meditation

The literal English translation of the Taize chant is “Nothing can trouble, nothing can frighten. Those who seek God shall never go wanting. Nothing can trouble, nothing can frighten. God alone fills us.”

Perhaps Jesus' message in today's Gospel inspired St Teresa to write her words when he said to his disciples: ***“Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.”*** There is so much to feel fearful about in our world and maybe with good reason, but do we let fear fill us or God fill us? Spend some time with these words of St Teresa and these words of Jesus. Offer to God the fears that dominate you and let this promise of peace and reassurance infiltrate your thinking.

First Reading

Acts 16.9-15

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, ‘Come over to Macedonia and help us.’ When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days.

On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there.

A certain woman named Lydia, a worshipper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, ‘If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home.’ And she prevailed upon us.

Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Revelation 21.10, 22 - 22.5

A Reading from the book of Revelation

In the spirit, the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day — and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honour of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there anymore. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign for ever and ever. Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

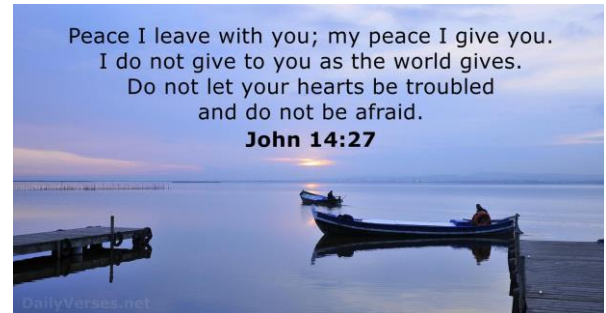

**** ST MARTIN'S HALL UPGRADE & PARISH APPEAL ****

On Sunday you will receive an envelope in your pew sheet for donations towards the **hall renovations at our St Martin's Church**. This work is long overdue and will enable greater use of this charming facility. As the hall is outside the scope of our ongoing National Trust Appeal we are running our own appeal for this work.

Stage one includes replacing the ceiling, upgrading the lights and fans and installing new wiring – Total cost \$18,912 ex GST. (\$15k of this will be funded from the Jean Redman Bequest which also funded the recent upgrade of the office computers).

Stage two includes painting the hall and passageway and installing new blinds for the windows – Early estimates for this work are about \$6,500 but we are still sourcing competitive quotes for this part of the work.

With the promise of some early donations already received, ceiling and electrical work of stage one will commence at St Martin's Church hall Friday 27th May. And we hope will be completed by Wednesday 8th June. Funds permitting Stage two will commence shortly after.

I have already committed a personal donation to this appeal and invite you to join me to whatever extent you can as we support the St Martin's congregation in this work.
