WORSHIP THEME: WE RELATE THEREFORE WE ARE

Priest's Message

The foundations of understanding God as Trinity are found in the New Testament (*The well-known Grace in 2 Corinthians 13:13 is a good example*).

However it was the Arian Controversy of the Fourth Century that really crystallized a more formalised theology of the Trinity. Arius affirmed the divinity of Christ but not in the same way as the 'Father' is divine. Christian theologians and church councils wanted to affirm the complete equality of the three persons of the Trinity. So we see this point really emphasized in the Nicene Creed (APBA p.123) which arose from the councils of Nicaea (325) and Constantinople (381). The Nicene creed stresses the equality of Jesus: *"eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made, of one being with the Father."* The Trinitarian equality within God is made even clearer in the Athanasian Creed (early 6th Century) – *"The Godhead of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, is all one: the Glory equal, the Majesty co-eternal."* (old Anglican tradition is to read the Athanasian Creed on Trinity Sunday. You'll be relieved to know we won't as it is very long, but you can read it for yourself in the green APBA p.487)



This important realisation of equality with complementarity within God has given rise to the understanding that all relationships should mirror the equality and complementarity of the Holy Trinity. For Christians this fundamentally changes the way we see the world and one another because it is always through the lens of the Trinity. Therefore today's theme, "we relate therefore we are" (misquoting Rene Descartes) affirms the Christian understanding of personhood - that it is only in relationship with the God of Relationship, and in relationship with the children of God, our human sisters and brothers, and in relationship with God's creation, that we fully realise and express who we are truly called to be. That is what we celebrate on this Trinity Sunday and every Sunday.

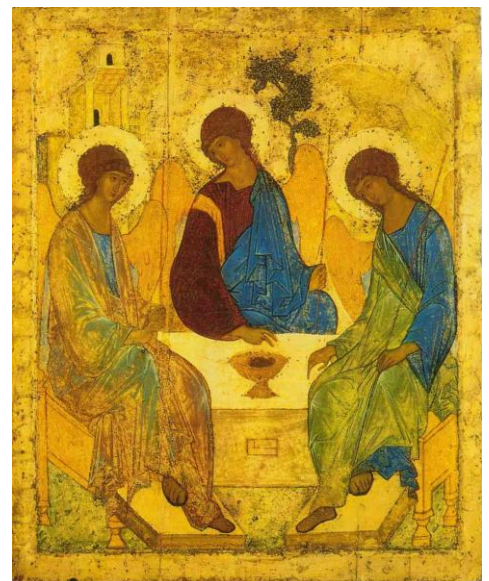
