Priest's Message

"Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." (1 Peter 2:5).

This is our calling, and the calling of all Christians, as today we celebrate the Patronal Festival of our church of St Peter. In our Gospel reading we hear how Jesus gives Simon the name 'Peter' (meaning rock). Jesus promises to build his church on *this* rock. We can wonder what Jesus meant by this. Did he mean that he would build the church literally on the leadership of Peter the rock? This has been a long-held view, however some point out that the authority given to Peter (Matthew 16:19) is also later given to all the disciples (Matthew 18:18). Others suggest that the rock on which Jesus will build his church is not the person of Simon Peter but rather the rock of his declaration of faith: *"You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God"* (Matthew 16:16). Perhaps both interpretations can be true – Jesus' church is built on all Jesus' disciples, for we are the living stones of the church, and also the church is built on the rock of our declarations of faith in word and action.

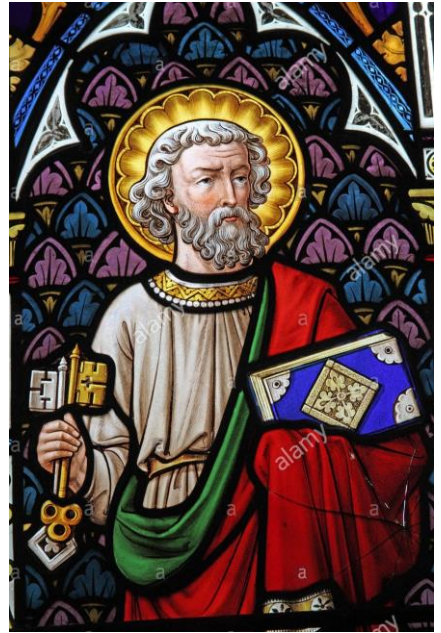


Today we celebrate a very human patron saint in St Peter. A follower of Christ who despite mistakes showed incredible persistence in faith. He is a role model for us of a disciple who can love well, receive forgiveness and keep on following faithfully. As the living stones of Jesus' church in this place may we continue to let ourselves be built into a spiritual house.

First Reading

Acts 15:5-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Some believers at the Council of Jerusalem, who belonged to the sect of the Pharisees stood up and said, "it is necessary for the Gentile believers to be circumcised and ordered to keep the law of Moses".

The apostles and the elders met together to consider this matter. After there had been much debate, Peter stood up and said to them, 'My brothers, you know that in the early days God made a choice among you, that I should be the one through whom the Gentiles would hear the message of the good news and become believers. And God, who knows the human heart, testified to them by giving them the Holy Spirit, just as he did to us; and in cleansing their hearts by faith he has made no distinction between them and us. Now therefore why are you putting God to the test by placing on the neck of the disciples a yoke that neither our ancestors nor we have been able to bear? On the contrary, we believe that we will be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, just as they will.'

A reading from the First Letter of Peter

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

'See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.'

To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe,

*'The stone that the builders rejected
has become the very head of the corner',*

and

*'A stone that makes them stumble,
and a rock that makes them fall.'*

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

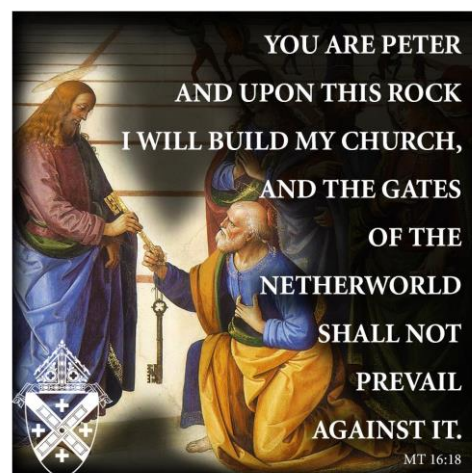

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

And Jesus answered him, “Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.” Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.



From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, ‘God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you.’ But he turned and said to Peter, ‘Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling-block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.’

Rev'd Michele will be on leave from Sunday, 2nd - 9th July. Rev'd Andrew will be on leave from 11th - 25th July.

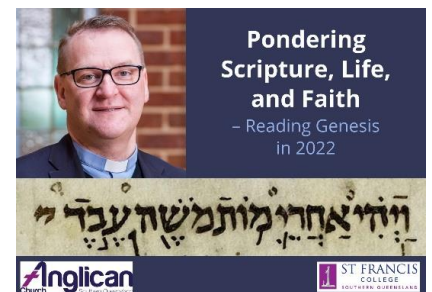
PARISH BOOK SALE, 7TH – 9TH JULY FROM 10AM – 2PM
