Priest's Message

When we look at the story of Mary, Martha and Jesus, is it cut and dry that Martha is annoyed and complains she's preparing a meal for Jesus and the disciples, while Martha doesn't and just listens?

Mary and Martha both welcome Jesus in their own way. Martha, shows affection through service and cooking a meal for people to whom she loves. While Mary radically goes against the female gendered role, and instead listens and learns from the teacher. If we look at the story from Jesus' eyes, He doesn't say who is right or wrong.

Each day there are opportunities to hear and follow God's word, if only we could stop, and without distraction listen to what, where and how God is leading not only us, and our community too. Faithful listening is responding to our call to listen to God's word of grace, then let it shape our lives and actions each day.

Genesis 18.1-10

A reading from the book of Genesis

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, 'My lord, if I find favour with you, do not pass by your servant.

Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant.' So they said, 'Do as you have said.' And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, 'Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.'

Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate. They said to him, 'Where is your wife Sarah?' Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

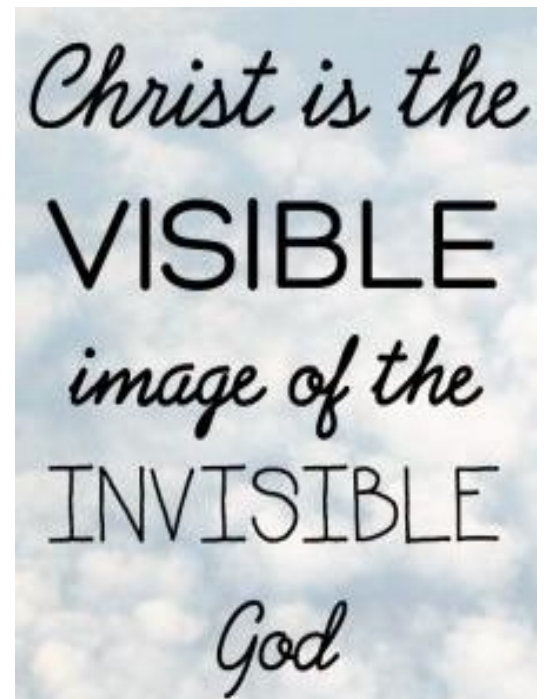

NEW INITIATIVE FOR FIRST SUNDAY OF THE MONTH AT 10AM

At the start of this year we said that we were discerning a new direction for the first Sunday of the month away from the JAM format and toward a more all-age friendly worship. With some experimentation in the first six months we have had a shorter format, included children from the start of the service, included a children's activity and a reflection and intercessions for the adults. Whilst these changes have tried to meet a diversity of needs our discernment for future directions has continued.

Parish Council has agreed to fund a new initiative centred around a Saturday 'creative music workshop' and Sunday worship involvement focussed on Primary aged children.

Free music and singing workshops on the first Saturday afternoon of each month followed by creative musical contribution during our worship together the next day at our 10am Family Worship service. These fun creative sessions will be run by renowned local singer and music educator Elizabeth McCall, and acclaimed Jazz violinist, composer and orchestrator, Julian Ferraretto.

LAMBETH CONFERENCE 26 JULY – 8TH AUGUST IN CANTERBURY

Every bishop of the Anglican Communion is invited to the Lambeth Conference – which is convened by The Most Reverend Justin Welby – The Archbishop of Canterbury. The Lambeth Conference has met since 1867, happens once-a-decade and is a significant event in the life of the Anglican Communion. The conference will explore church and world affairs. Outcomes of the conference will shape the life of the Anglican Communion in the decade ahead.



1 Peter – The biblical theme for the conference

As the Lambeth Conference explores the theme of being 'God's Church for God's World', the Biblical focus for the event will be the book of 1 Peter. Each day the conference community will listen to a Bible Exposition and take part in a Bible study. The Bible study groupings will mix bishops from different dioceses around the world, so that they can hear more about one another's contexts. Bishops' wives and husbands will also meet for their own programme of Bible study.

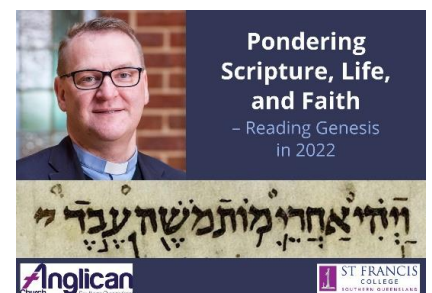


Themes being discussed

Each day, the Lambeth Conference will combine a programme of Bible Study with bishops' discussions on key themes in the life of the church, including: Mission and Evangelism, Anglican Identity, Christian Unity, Inter Faith matters, Discipleship, Safe Church, Reconciliation, Human Identity and Environment and Sustainable Development.

INVITATION TO ONLINE LECTURES ON GENESIS

Rev'd Associate Professor Matthew Anstey will be giving 10 online lectures next semester, on 10 key passages from Genesis, reflecting on pressing contemporary issues, including human sexuality/gender, disability, violence, creation care etc. They will be hosted by St Francis Theological College, Brisbane.



The lectures won't be recorded, so viewing online is the sole option. The lectures will be on Tuesday afternoons, 3:00-4:30pm Adelaide time. The dates are 12,19,26 July; 9,16,23 Aug; 13,20,27 Sep; 4 Oct. The cost is \$20 per lecture or \$100 for all ten. All proceeds go to St Francis College.
