Priest's Message

On Friday 9th September 2022, we in Australia have awoken to the news that Queen Elizabeth II died on 8th September and that her eldest son has acceded the throne as Charles III,



King of United Kingdom and 15 Commonwealth Realms (of which Australia is one). This Sunday we will offer prayers of thankfulness for Queen Elizabeth's long reign through years of great change. Her life was one of community service and she was respected for her constancy, compassion and faithfulness.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Most Reverend and Right Honourable Justin Welby, has written to the Primates (Senior Archbishops) of the Anglican Communion. In that letter he writes:

As Supreme Governor of the Church of England, and as a faithful Christian disciple, Her Late Majesty lived out her faith every day of her life. Her trust in God and profound love for him was foundational in how she led her life – hour by hour, day by day.

In Her Late Majesty's life we saw what it means to receive the gift of life we have been given by God and – through patient, humble, selfless service – share it as a gift to others.

Her Late Majesty found great joy and fulfilment in the service of her people and her God "whose service is perfect freedom" (BCP). For giving her whole life to us, and allowing her life of service to be an instrument of God's peace among us, we owe Her Late Majesty a debt of gratitude beyond measure.



INTERESTED IN CONFIRMATION?

Bishop Denise Ferguson will be visiting our **10am service on Sunday 20**th **November**. This is a great opportunity for those seeking confirmation.

Confirmation - For those baptised as infants you can confirm your faith when you reach youth/adult years. The confirmation service is on page 84 of the green prayerbook. You will see that the promises are the same as those made at baptism. The bishop will then pray for you to receive the Holy Spirit and confirm your faith. Reception into the Anglican Church - members of other denominations can also be received into the Anglican church when the bishop visits (see page 96).

Affirmation — an opportunity for anyone who has already been confirmed to publicly reaffirm their faith and receive prayers from the bishop (see p.91).

So far there are three adults interested in being confirmed, and two interested in being received into the Anglican church. Speak to Rev Andrew or Rev Michele if you would like more information. We will organise some preparation sessions soon.

ADMISSION TO COMMUNION

For younger children (7-10 years) who are not yet ready to be confirmed but who are ready to learn more about communion and receive their first communion, we are able to organise some preparation for this also. Preparation is done mostly at home through a workbook along with a couple sessions with the priest and parents. Minimum age for admission to communion is 7 years old. REVIEW OF CHAPLAINCY SURVEY – CAN YOU HELP PLEASE?

The new Federal Government is undertaking a review of the National School Chaplaincy program. This program is greatly appreciated by the schools (both public and private). Here is a link to the online consultation survey.

PS: Some important things to note in completing the survey:

- 1. This is a personal questionnaire, not a group or organisational survey and closes on September 13.
- 2. The Survey may take up to half an hour to complete. **Please be patient**, and persist, for the sake of your school's Pastoral Care Worker
- 3. You can **choose** to remain anonymous
- 4. Terms and acronyms **NSCP** = National School Chaplaincy Program (the source of funds used to pay for Pastoral Care Workers). Chaplains are called Pastoral Care Workers only in South Australia, elsewhere in Australia they are Chaplains.
- 5. The survey may imply a lack of comparative qualifications between chaplains and welfare/youth workers. All Chaplains in Australia are REQUIRED to possess the minimum qualifications of a Certificate IV in Youth Work or similar. In SA 59% of SMG Pastoral Care Workers exceed this minimum qualification level.
- **6.** Some questions ask for comments. Please add your personal stories whenever you can **this is what the agency really needs to hear.**
- 7. If you have preferences in your school community for more people, more hours, or differences in service please specify them in your responses.

At **7:45am** (St Peter's) you will need this news sheet and a green prayerbook (p.119). At **8:45am** (St Martin's) you will be greeted with a news sheet, prayer & hymnbooks to use. At **10am** (St Peter's) you only need this news sheet as the service is on the powerpoint screen.

Toilets are located, at St Peter's, along the passageway, under the projector screen. At St Martin's, they are in the corridor adjacent to the worship space.

Feel free to join in with all aspects of worship as you feel comfortable. Please be aware that visitors are warmly welcome to receive communion with us.
