Priest's Message

Jesus' parable of the unjust judge and the persistent widow is as humorous as it is encouraging. The disparity between these two figures is stark. The judge is a powerful man whereas the widow was a woman of little power at that time. The Judge does not fear God, in other words is not a faithful person, and though we are not told that the widow is faithful, the point of the parable is that she has great persistent faith. Jesus sets up this parable to teach us about persisting in prayer and to humorously point out that whilst God is completely unlike the unjust judge, but we are to be exactly like the widow when it comes prayer. We persist in the very knowledge that God is far more faithful and loving and just than the judge in the parable. Of course, it is not always easy to persist in prayer. We can be tempted to give up when it seems like our prayers are unanswered, so we need all the encouragement we can get.



The letter to Timothy carries a similar message to persist and never give up in regards to sharing our faith. In this passage we are told to: *"proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching."* Today we pray that God will continue to give us the Holy Spirit to inspire and encourage us, to enable us in our gifts to live the Gospel and to be people who persist in prayer, praise and proclamation for the good news we believe.



First Reading

Jeremiah 31:27-34

A reading from the Book of Jeremiah

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will sow the house of Israel and the house of Judah with the seed of humans and the seed of animals. And just as I have watched over them to pluck up and break down, to overthrow, destroy, and bring evil, so I will watch over them to build and to plant, says the Lord. In those days they shall no longer say:


‘The parents have eaten sour grapes, and the children’s teeth are set on edge.’ But all shall die for their own sins; the teeth of everyone who eats sour grapes shall be set on edge.

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, ‘Know the Lord’, for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

**Second Reading****2 Timothy 3:14-4:5****A reading from the second Letter to Timothy**

Continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching.

For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.
