Priest's Message

Zacchaeus was on the outer. We wouldn't have liked him. He took our hard-earned money and gave it to the Romans, keeping a percentage for himself. We would've felt that Zacchaeus should stay on the outer



and didn't deserve to see or speak to Jesus. We would've felt that Jesus was for us and our kind, not for him and his kind. Except Jesus didn't see it that way. Jesus was for inclusion. Jesus saw God's kingdom being for everyone.

Have you ever noticed that Jesus doesn't ask Zacchaeus to believe any particular thing, or behave in any particular way? Jesus simply says: "Zacchaeus, I must stay at your house today". Through this simple interaction, the experience of moving from the outer to inclusion is enough to transform Zacchaeus' life, and bring him into the kingdom way of living.

Today we celebrate CVS Sunday.

The Community Visitors Scheme is a wonderful example of the church reaching out to those on the outer. Through the CVS program volunteers visit elderly, isolated and lonely



but the righteous live by their faith.




