#### ADVENT WREATH LITURGY

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

“I was glad when they said to me,  
‘Let us go to the house of the Lord!’”

*(Psalm 122:1)*



**We are glad to be here in this community of faith,  
It is a place of joyful hope, of radical welcome.  
It is a place where, together, we can wait

#### A reading from the Prophet Isaiah

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.' For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!

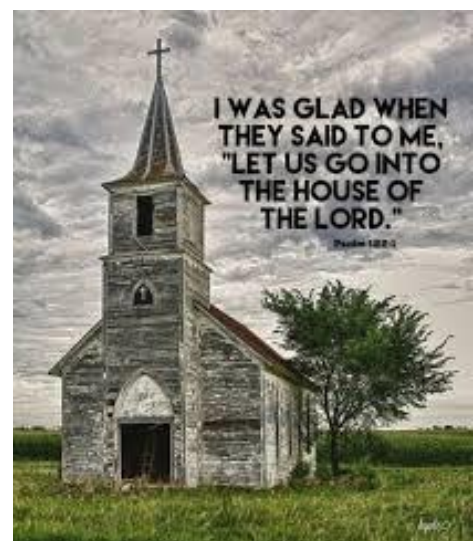

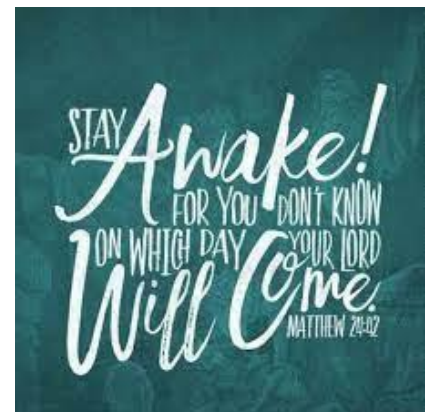
## Gospel

✠ The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

### Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus spoke to his disciples: 'About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left.



Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.

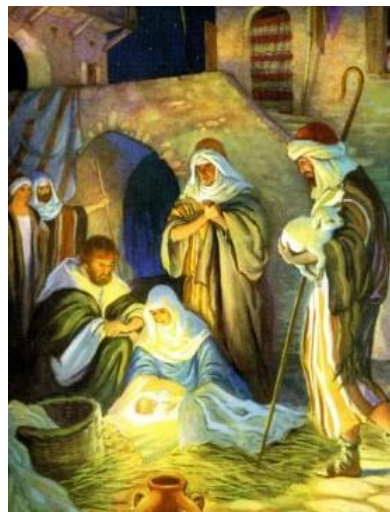

## REFLECTION - The 'O' Antiphons of Advent

Since the seventh century, this set of seven prayer texts has been sung or recited over the final days of Advent during the daily service of vespers, or evening prayer. They are voiced in response to the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55)

*O Wisdom, O Holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care:  
Come and show your people the way to salvation.*

*O Sacred Lord of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush,  
who gave him the Holy Law on Sinai. Come, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free.*

*O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples;  
rulers stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you.  
Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid.*

*O Key of David, O Royal Power of Israel, controlling at your will the gate of heaven:  
Come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the  
shadow of death, and lead your captive people into freedom.*

*O Radiant Dawn, Splendour of Eternal Light, Sun of Justice:  
Come, shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.*

*O Ruler of all the nations, the only joy of every human heart, O keystone of the mighty  
arch of humankind: Come and save the creature you fashioned from the dust.*

*O Emmanuel, Ruler and Lawgiver, Desire of the Nations, Saviour of all people:  
Come and set us free, Lord our God.*
