"The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom. It shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing. And the ransomed of the LORD shall return and come to Zion



with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away." (Isaiah 35:1-2, 10).

We hear the prophet's words to ascend to God's house with joy. We claim God's promise to unburden us and set us free, May we live fully in the grace and wonder of God's gift of life, And travel our journey with God's joy in our hearts.

The Psalmist says "Happy are these whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord... who made heaven and earth... who keeps faith.... who executes justice... who gives food... who sets prisoners free... who opens eyes... who lifts up... who watches over us... who upholds us.... Praise the Lord!" (Psalm 146)

We light these candles of joyous hope, of proclaimed peace, and of deep and everlasting joy, as a sign that we are those who walk with a joyful skip in our step because we are ascending to God's promise.

Light three candles on the Advent wreath including the rose coloured candle of Joy.

Ch. Christmas is coming the church is glad to sing
And let the Advent candles brightly burn in a ring
The third is for the Baptist who cried, 'prepare the way.
Be ready for Jesus, both this and every day.'

Sustain us, O God, with the power of your love on our journey to meet the One who is coming: strengthen our weak hands, make firm our feeble knees, and open blind eyes to the dawning of your kingdom, so that our hearts may rejoice

as we behold the majesty of our God.

We ask this through your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**



First Reading Isaiah 35:1-10

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you."

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; ⁶then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp, the grass shall become reeds and rushes. A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it, but it shall be for God's people; no traveller, not even fools, shall go astray. No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there. And the ransomed of the LORD shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

God has mercy on those who fear him: from generation to generation.


The Lord has shown strength with his arm: and scattered the proud in their conceit,



This tallied to over \$2,800 value, which was our quarter share of the "Bags of Love" Food Drive. From the 1st - 3rd Dec. Jeanette and Val, along with many others, worked for three days straight collecting, sorting, packing and valuing donated food and grocery items. Jeanette and Val want to thank the people from our parish who came and helped with the food collection at Brighton. Thanks also to, Anthea Smith, Graeme Smith and Ros Mortimer who helped carry, unpack and sort the food into our storeroom. We also acknowledge the support of the community of Brighton for their generosity of donations of food and other items, the support of IGA, Taplin Real Estate and especially the members of the Rotary Club of Holdfast Bay who support our emergency food cupboard so well.

Coles, at Glenelg, has also given their regular support with their donation of 400 bags for food distribution.

Between all who donate to our parish emergency food cupboard, we have supported 97 individuals and families with a total of over 520 food packages since the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ February and the year is not over yet. .
