Priest's Message

A new liturgical year begins with the season of Advent. In our three year cycle of bible readings we move to Year B (The Gospel of Mark). The readings for the next twelve months will predominantly be taken from the Gospel of Mark except where other Gospel references are needed to fill in the gaps.



Next year during Lent we will offer a daily reading program through the Gospel of Mark which promises to be a wonderful inspiration.

The season of Advent is more than just a preparation for Christmas. It is also about the anticipation of Christ's final coming. We see the shift through this season which begins with the anticipation of the coming of the Day of the Lord, to the later readings which are more focused on the coming of Christ at Christmas. As we enter Advent our regular communion response takes on deeper meaning —

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

O come, O come, and be our God-with-us
O long-sought With-ness for a world without
O secret seed, O hidden spring of light.
Come to us Wisdom, come unspoken Name
Come Root, and Key, and King, and holy Flame,
O quickened little wick so tightly curled,

First Reading Isaiah 64:1-9

A reading from the book of Isaiah

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity.

Yet, O Lord, you are our Father;

we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand.

He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless

on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

★ The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus said to his disciples: 'But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in clouds" with great power and glory. Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.

'From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake.'
