

Priest's Message

How are you going with your Lenten journey so far? If you're like me, you start with a flurry of good intentions, sticking to the things you intended to give up, praying a bit more, reading that inspirational book you had planned, but then life gets in the way and you miss a few days and the wheels start to fall off.



Well if that fits you, then that sounds about normal. Its all ok! Don't give up, just accept that the Christian life isn't about being perfect, its about turning and returning to God, time after time. Lent is a great season to be more intentional, but just like the whole of our Christian journey, we won't always get it right.

Confession time! During the week I attended a celebratory service and received an academic achievement award for the study I did last year. That was very nice as were the drinks afterwards, until halfway through my glass of wine I remembered that I'd given up alcohol for Lent! Sometimes we just forget. But the great thing about a discipline like that is it acts as a reminder. In that little moment I was reminded of a discipline I had freely chosen in order to focus on the meaning of Lent. It's tempting to be tough on ourselves, but I'll laugh at myself and put a bit extra into the ABM Lent appeal and just keep trying. That's all any of us can do.

Today's gospel reading shows Simon Peter getting it wrong and being rebuked by Jesus. Just a few verses earlier [Mark 8:29] Peter had got it so right in declaring that Jesus was the Messiah. Each of us is on the journey with Jesus. Like Peter, sometimes we grasp our faith so well and it illumines our path, at other times we stumble along, making mistakes and not really feeling in tune with God. Welcome to being human! We can put ourselves down for this, or we can shake it off, start again, pick up the cross and return to the Lord again and again and again. Lenten blessings to you all.

Genesis 17.1-7, 15-16

A reading from the book of Genesis

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, 'I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous.' Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, 'As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer



shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

God said to Abraham, 'As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.'


Second Reading

Romans 4.13-25

A reading from the letter to the Romans

The promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, 'I have made you the father of many nations')—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become 'the father of many nations', according to what was said, 'So numerous shall your descendants be.'



He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith 'was reckoned to him as righteousness.' Now the words, 'it was reckoned to him', were written not for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

Jesus began to teach his disciples that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter



and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.
